Playground and Park Improvements

2016 saw park improvements to **Clare Salisbury Park** (Clearmeadow Public School) and **Paul Semple Park** (Armitage Village Public School) including the addition of playground structures, park benches, tri-waste containers, trees, and resurfacing for accessibility.

Community Ice Rink

The **Whipper Billy Watson Park Volunteer Community Ice Rink** is open daily until 9:30, with lighting temporary bathroom, hockey nets and benches. The rink will allow for the enjoyment of both hockey and pleasure skating. Thank you to volunteers for a third successful season.

FURTHERING TRAFFIC SAFETY FOR WARD 6

In-Street Bollard Pilot Project

Flexible bollards have been installed at Savage Road and Ivsbridge Boulevard to create a visual “road diet”, a narrowing with the goal of slowing down vehicular traffic in the area.

Radar Speed Boards

Radar Speed Boards, showing the driver their speed, can be seen around town. If the driver's speed is greater than the limit, the display will start to flash, reminding the driver to slow down.

Stop Signs

Stop control for the McCaffrey/Rannie intersection has been the subject of review over past years. In 2016, stop signs were installed.
