SCHOOL ZONE TRAFFIC SAFETY

TRAFFIC CALMING BOLLARDS

Ward 6 is entering the second year on a pilot project using bollards to provide pop-up traffic calming that is removable, inexpensive and effective in achieving "Traffic Calmed" neighbourhoods. These bollards can be experienced on Savage Road, Sawmill Valley Drive and Sandford Street. The bollards are used in conjunction with an electronic speed board and a law enforced *Zero Tolerance Policy*.

Recently, at Kelly Broome's Ward 6 Community Safety Open House, York Regional Police Constable Roman Santos and Sergeant Mark Altermann urged residents to slow down on our neighbourhood streets. They also agreed that the bollards were a great idea and happy to see them being used.






SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY: PHOTO TRAFFIC CAMERAS TO COME

An important addition to school zone safety will soon be via photo traffic cameras. Bill 65, Safer School Zones Act, 2017 amends the Highway Traffic Act and addresses the ability of municipalities to set speed limits within their borders and use automated speed enforcement systems and red light camera systems.

FURTHERING TRAFFIC SAFETY AT RANNIE AND MCCAFFREY

RECOMMENDATIONS THAT Development and Infrastructure Services Report – ES 2015-34 dated September 29, 2016 entitled "McCaffrey Road — Traffic Review #2" be received and the following recommendations be adopted:

- 1. THAT a 3-way stop sign be installed at the intersection of McCaffrey and Rannie Road;
- 2. AND THAT Traffic By-law 2011-24 Schedule 3 Stop Signs, as amended, be further amended by deleting: Rannie Road at McCaffrey Road 1 way northbound on Rannie Road;
- 3. AND THAT Traffic By-law 2011-24 Schedule 3 Stop Signs, as amended, be further amended by adding: Rannie Road at McCaffrey Road 3 way northbound on Rannie Road McCaffrey Road at Rannie Road 3-way eastbound on McCaffrey Road McCaffrey Road at Rannie Road 3-way westbound on McCaffrey Road;
- 4. AND THAT the necessary By-law be prepared and submitted to Council for their approval.

NEWMARKET VOTERS TO CAST ELECTRONIC BALLOTS IN 2018

Newmarket Council is the first municipality in York Region to adopt a fully electronic Municipal Election for 2018.



Next year, Newmarket voters will have an opportunity to participate in a more environmentally-friendly, accessible and convenient method of voting. Residents will now be able to cast their vote online or by telephone.

In addition to being able to cast their ballot remotely, voters will also have the option to attend in-person locations equipped with electronic voting stations available on certain dates and times.
