Ward 6 Community Safety

- A Peter Hall and Sawmill Valley Drive: New stop sign
- B Mulock Drive: Speed limit revision
- Clearmeadow Blvd and Bathurst Street: Approved traffic light
- Sandford Drive, Savage Road, Sawmill Valley Drive, and Clearmeadow Blvd: Newmarket's first traffic calming pilot project to Ward 6 residential streets
- **B** Rannie & Mccaffrey: New all-way stop sign
- **School Crossing**: All-new fully accessible dedicated school crossing guard location
- **School Zones**: New road safety and road watch for school zones public education campaigns
- **Mounted Speed Boards**: Seven new solar mounted speed boards which change location every 90 days.

Playgrounds, Trails, Parks and Sports Fields

- Clare Salisbury Park: All-new playground, basket ball court, swings, bike rack and picnic table
- Jim Bond Park: Existing trails converted to asphalt, new benches, tri-waste containers and proposal for lighting
- **Keffer Parkette**: New swing set
- Paul Semple Park: All-new playground, new wood fibre (replace sand), swing set, and trees
- Seneca Cook Parkette: All-new larger playground, new wood chips, picnic table, tri-waste, and trees
- Whipper Billy Watson Park: All-new playground, wood fibre (replace sand), existing trails to be converted to asphalt, accessibility ramp to be installed from the asphalt trail to the playground surfacing, installation of new park furniture around the playground, trails and ball diamond, basketball area to be resurfaced
- Tom Taylor Trail: Connectivity and completion

New Affordable Recreation

- P Fitness Centre: Opened Newmarket's first town owned and operated fitness centre
- Volunteer Outdoor Ice Rink: Opened Newmarket's first volunteer outdoor ice rink
- R Spray Pad and Water Park: Approved Ward 6 first spray pad and water park

Heritage and Green Space Protection and Conservation

S Mulock Farm Estate

Town of Newmarket has agreed to the purchase of the 11.6 acres of land at the north-west corner of Mulock Drive and Yonge Street, known to the community as the Mulock Farm Estate. The vision is to create an iconic community park and outdoor green space which includes land to accommodate a skating rink, walking trails and a one-kilometre skating trail throughout the site.
